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Course Description:

Afghan Mittens

In 1978, my college roommate traveled through Afghanistan, and came home with a husband for herself and a pair of mittens for me. These mittens have intrigued me over the years as they are knitted from the fingertips to the wrist in handspun yarn with wonderful motifs! They are finely knitted on very small needles. We will explore knitting mittens from the top down in motifs that are reminiscent of those from that part of the world.

Level: Intermediate to Advanced (Must be proficient with DP needles, Magic Loop, or working with two circulars). Prior experience in stranded (two-color) knitting is helpful.

The Cowichan-Inspired Pullover

Course Description:

On Vancouver Island in British Columbia, the Coast Salish people developed this V-necked, shawl-collared garment after learning of knitting through Europeans who visited their area. The Salish prefer motifs that reflect the natural world (whales, birds, etc.) as well as geometric motifs. The sweaters, still handspun by some people, are knitted flat on double-pointed needles, with thick singles yarns in 2 or 3 colors. This class will cover working with up to three colors in a row and weaving (on the right side and wrong side), reading a chart, putting stripes in ribbing (without color distortion), knitting pockets, a traditional shoulder join, creating a shawl collar shaped with short rows, knitting sleeves from the top down while shaping the cap, and hand-sewing in a zipper, or working a button band.



Level: Intermediate to Advanced (Must be proficient with DP needles, Magic Loop, or working with two circulars). Prior stranded (two-color) knitting experience is preferred..
